- Engineering students find the experience to be invaluable, giving them insights into the maintainability of the products that they may be designing in the future.
- Students working in the automotive shop learn basic vehicle maintenance, repair, and problem solving techniques which they will use for years to come.
- Administrative interns write procedures, update social media, help train volunteers in new software, and help in a variety of other areas as their gifting and training allow.
- It's a great opportunity for the students to interface with and serve missionaries from all over the world.
- Working with other volunteers enhances interns' interpersonal skills and infuses energy into our staff.
- Occasionally, staff members host the interns for meals in their homes, further enriching their relationships.
- This year, one of our interns is raising his own support, which has given him a taste of what many missionaries experience.
