WHEN picking up a van, our missionaries often have traveled multiple days, having slept in airports, been crammed in airplane seats ... They arrive at 1440 E. Veterans Memorial Parkway, Truesdale, MO – hungry, and sometimes ... a little stressed. This is no problem for our team! When the missionaries walk through our doors, we do everything possible to ease their stress and calm their nerves. The first thing we give them is liquid energy from our coffee shop. Anything Starbuck's can do, we can do better! Next, we take them to our 'Blessings Boutique,' where they can select from a collection of new and gently used clothes. Of course, if they are hungry, we feed them!

After the nerves have been calmed ... our staff will walk the missionaries through the necessary paperwork and provide helpful information to make their leasing experience easy and worry-free. After that, we introduce them to their vehicle – which has been serviced and cleaned, inside and out.

The vehicle is stocked with goodie bags which were prepared by our 'Goodie Bag Volunteer Team.' We have years of experience doing this, so we know exactly what to put in each goodie bag ... items missionaries often need like toiletries and other necessities.



Kids receive their own personalized, special treats, and every family receives a bag full of delicious healthy and unhealthy snacks! One of the neat things we do is to provide each family with a blanket that is embroidered with their family name.

These extra touches have tremendous meaning to our missionary families. Often, when the families receive the goodie bags they become emotional - because of the blessing these gifts are to them. When you support the ministry, you share in this blessing. On behalf of every missionary and every kid – a great big **THANK YOU!**

Before the family departs, our staff, volunteers, and interns lift up the missionary family in prayer. We ask God that their time in the United States would be fruitful, that He'd protect them on the road and provide unexpected blessings along the way. We pray for their meetings and presentations. We ask God to supply their financial needs and sustain the work on the mission field while the family is away. We ask for safety and good health.

Once the missionaries have left our little oasis of love and encouragement, we continue to pray, support and encourage.



MY wife, Margie, and I were missionaries in Ecuador from 2016 to 2025. We worked with Reaching and Teaching International Ministries. In February of 2020, we returned stateside for a six-week furlough. A few weeks later, the world shut down because of COVID, and we were unable to return to Ecuador until December of 2020. For 10 months, we were 'stuck' in the USA! Needing transportation, we looked online and found Righteous Rides.

Our experience was amazing. The vehicle was affordable to rent, and the staff was thoughtful, helpful and caring. When we picked up the van, I thought we'd just pick it up and leave, but the Hub Coordinator invited us to their home, took an interest and got to know us.
